CONSECRATION SUNDAY IS COMING

Our congregation's council has selected the "New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program" as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship emphasis this year.

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, financial contributions are a way to help people grow spiritually by supporting the church's mission with a percentage of their income.

"New Consecration Sunday" is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Rather than treating people as members of a club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus who want to give as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate giving, responding to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and

members to make their financial commitments to our church's ministries. Everyone who completes an "Estimate of Giving" card does so voluntarily during worship on Consecration Sunday. We also urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The process is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to complete a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship, Pr Wayne will provide a period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform and inspire Consecration Sunday participants.

Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday events.

Your eyes do not deceive you! Work is being done on Hosanna House.

I've had many people tell me they wish we could return to one Sunday School Hour held between the two Sunday services. (Children together; Fellowship Coffee Hour) This change of course would impact the Sunday service times. It was briefly discussed at Council. Due to the space this combining of classes would require, it probably couldn't happen until Hosanna House is completed.

To make this change, council first needs a lot of input from the congregation. If you want to keep the Service times as they are, we need to hear that. If you have suggestions, or important points you want to make about Service time changes, now is the time to speak up.

The Sound System Fund Drive is making great progress, more on that next month. Sometime late in August I received a phone call. Several members of our congregation were at Church one evening for a meeting and some travelers stopped by asking for help. Their car had broken down. They knew how to fix it, but it was getting late and they had no place to stay, no money for a room or food. They were on their way home to Tennessee, and needed help. It must have been right before payday, because no one had much cash. To make a long story short, a collection provided enough money for a night's lodging and a couple meals.

Sometimes the answers are not so clear. What is always clear, is that the people of Hosanna do God's work.

News from the Interiors

Committee...

The Interiors/Exteriors Oversight Committee was busy over the summer working with an advisory panel of church council and congregation members to improve the Interiors request process. The result will hopefully be a smoother process for all who are requesting changes to the function and appearance of the church or Hosanna House. I would like to use this article to remind the congregation of the process for requesting and completing modifications to the church space. If you wish to make any renovations or purchase furnishings for any building belonging to Hosanna, please use the following procedures:

1. Contact the church office for the Hosanna Interiors Renovation/Furnishings Purchase Request form, or the Pre-Screening form. These forms are now also on the church website, and can be printed from the site.
2. Submit the completed form to the Hosanna Oversight Committee in its mailbox by the church office.
3. Individuals on the Interiors Oversight Committee will review the request, and will contact the applicant to review the request and receive any further needed information.
4. A decision will usually be made within two weeks of the meeting and applicant will be contacted with the recommendations. You should plan on one month for the entire process

A new form, the Pre-Screening form, was developed for individuals who would like some feedback or guidance prior to doing the research necessary to complete the long form. The form will provide some guidance to direct the individual to a particular furniture type, or decorative style that will fit the current church décor.

Please remember that the chosen furniture style for the church is the Mission/Art and Crafts style. This may save you time when pursuing a furniture purchase.

Also, please refrain from going to individual members of the Interiors Oversight Committee to

ask for approval of a project. Please remember that decisions should be made by the entire committee, and the paperwork must be completed before a project can be approved.

I will be happy to clarify or answer questions about the process at any time. Please contact me with any questions. The committee looks forward to working with the congregation in a positive way on its projects over the next year.

Mecklenburg Partners...are sponsoring a trip to Germany. The dates for the trip are June 13th – 27th, 2007.

Vacation Element: The first days are in southern Germany—land in Munich, Saizburg, Linderhof, Oberammergau, Ettal. In other words the Bavaria that most people regard as Germany—view the Alps, Baroque cathedrals, castles, maybe an oompah band.

Education Element: The middle days are in middle Germany—the land of Luther. Experiencing our Lutheran Heritage—Eisleben where he was born and baptized (and died), Eisenach where he was educated (grade school), Erfurt (where he became a monk and priest, Wittenberg (where he taught and began the Reformation), the Wartburg (where he translated the NT into German). There will also be time in Berline—two highlights will be the Checkpoint Charlie Museum and the Pergamon Museum (ruins from ancient Babylon).

Inspirational Element: By far the best part will be the home stays in the partner congregation. This time will include a Sunday so that everyone can experience worship in the partner church. But, we will also do things together, especially as we experience the history of the church in communist

times with the Iron Curtain, the Stasi secret police, the states attempt to replace confirmation with youth dedication, etc. We will see the beautiful Zistercian monastery (now Lutheran) in Bad Doberan, visit Schwerin the capital and the cathedral, hopefully dialogue with Bishop Hermann Beste. We'll fly home from Hamburg. Cost: \$3769 per person based on 30 people registering for the trip. The cost includes tips (which are considerable), breakfasts and dinners (we are on our own except for one common lunch that is ordered in Salzburg), plane tickets, bus, driver, guide, hotels, etc.

"I have only one condition," he said. "At his funeral, you must say my brother was a saint."

The pastor gave his word and deposited the check.

The next day at the funeral, the pastor did not hold back. "He was an evil man," he said. "He cheated on his wife and abused his family." After going on in this vein for a small time, he concluded with, "But, compared to his brother, he was a saint."
