From the Pastor

Thirty Years of Mission!

Thirty years ago our steering committee was preparing for its first worship service in the cafeteria of Etna Elementary. We were planning the ministry out of the green bungalow at the corner of Main Street and W 2nd Street in Pataskala. It was the home of Al and Irene Kauber. Our family had just moved into our home on December 1st. The church office was an upstairs bedroom; the "printer" was a used IBM typewriter and a spirit master duplicating machine. Fellowship events were held on Sunday evenings as a warm up to build a base of a congregation. We were working off borrowed money and the good will of many, many people.

Where did those first folks come from? Several central Ohio area churches promoted "The ALC Mission in Pataskala," encouraging their folks to be part of a new mission, sharing the gospel in new and unexpected ways. Herb Willey, the Pataskala post master gave us a "List of 100." These were people who had received mail from a Lutheran connection in the last year. Phone calls and house visits were made. Everything was about inviting, gathering and worshipping the Triune God. We were a church in mission.

We are still a church in mission. Over these years we have never "had it made." We have pushed the edge, taking chances, always trying to be "bigger"

than we were. We didn't always do things well. Not infrequently, we disagreed with one another on how to "get it done." Ralph McLeod, the first president of our steering committee announced, "This church cares more about people than the building." As I think back, he set a tone that has always played in the mind of the people. "We live Christ's will to share God's love with all." That mission statement came out of the heart of Randy Rich twenty five years later.

2008 begins with an Invitation Sunday, January 13th. It is the thirtieth anniversary of our first worship service. I know that over the years we have formed our subgroups of friendship within the congregation. These have been a wonderful source of encouragement and consolation in the name of Christ. We will also be concerned about our building and the financial resources we need to share God's love with all. But, let us never forget, we are a people in mission; always have been, always will. We have been given the immense honor of sharing the gospel of Jesus with our neighbors and community. We care that people hear that message in whatever way the Holy Spirit chooses to reveal it. We care about people. We live to Christ's will to share God's love with all.

Merry Christmas. It is a difficult time to be on Church Council, but I hope that does not obscure the bigger picture: Our Savior is born. Merry Christmas.

By now everyone has had an opportunity to read the letter that Rich King, as head of stewardship, has written at the request of Council. I believe that the information in the letter accurately reflects our financial status. Please prayerfully consider how you, as a member of Hosanna, respond to that letter.

When it came time to write this article I was pulled in several ways. Part of me wants to explain everything. Justification is something we all do at times and I think I could do a pretty good job of that when it comes to Hosanna's finances. Another part of me wants to cheerlead, be positive, point out all the good things we have done, lay out the great future that lies before us. Then there are all the doubts and fears. The what if's that lead down a dismal path. Yet, none of these choices seem quite right.

I've heard some concerns that Hosanna should be run more like a business. I disagree. Oh, I know some honest mistakes have occurred in previous years, but I know from experience that we are doing a more professional job with our finances than we were five years ago. Under Mark Borrer our finances have become more transparent. Rich's proposed budgets have been clear in outlining our needs. The only way to run Hosanna more like a business is to charge a fee at the door. [If your not sure, that is a joke, not a proposal.]

When I consider what we could have done better, over the last few years, it is in Evangelism that I personally feel we haven't done a good job. I could provide a few justifications for that, but the simple truth is that we Lutherans haven't been intentional about reaching out. We need to stop hiding our light under the bushel basket. Kim Wysocki has plans for Evangelism that I'm sure you'll hear about. The simple truth, though, is that her committee can't do it all, they can only lead the congregation. MONEY MATTERS, FACTS AND FIGURES

Correction - Due to a misinterpretation of data, last month's report should have indicated a operating deficit of \$27,327.45 at the end of October. I apologize for the confusion.

Offerings for the month of November again fell short of covering church operating expenses and the deficit increased to **\$29,592.54**. This figure includes the \$14,481.87 deficit brought over from the end of 2006. The year-to-date operating deficit for 2007 alone now stands at a negative \$15,110.67 through eleven months of this year.

On a positive note, offerings improved through the first two Sundays of December to reduce the total operating deficit to **\$24,289.56**.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: To ensure the deductibility of your church contributions, do not file your 2007 income tax return until you have received a written acknowledgment of your contributions from the church.

Wheat Ridge Ministries Awards 19 Congregation Health and Hope Grants Itasca, IL - Wheat Ridge Ministries, an independent Lutheran non-profit organization, recently awarded \$35,119 in Congregation Health and Hope Grants to 19 Lutheran congregations across the country. The purpose of the Congregation Health and Hope Grants is to facilitate the initial development of congregation-based health and wellness ministries. All Lutheran congregations - individually or in partnership with other congregations - are eligible for these grants. "Wheat Ridge Ministries is pleased to offer assistance to Lutheran congregations who are starting ministries of health and hope," said Brian Becker, Vice President for Ministry Programs. "What a great way to reach out to your community with the love of Christ. Another exciting outcome is that this type of ministry helps to energize its members, which often times leads to the overall spiritual and physical growth of a congregation." The focus of the Health and Hope Grant is on new congregation-based health ministries developed under the auspices of a congregation health committee or cabinet. Projects must support and promote the health and well-being of people in the congregation and local community. Grants of up to \$2,000 are awarded and the amount granted must be matched by the congregation. Grant funds may be invested in health-related events and leadership development, staff training, planning, materials, resources or equipment directly related to program development; or contract - more-Lutherans seeding new ministries of health and hope in the name of the healing Christ. Wheat Ridge Ministries Awards 19 Congregation Health and Hope Grants services or new staff essential for program development. The grant is not to be used for existing staff salaries, congregation or school building programs or general church or school expenses. Wheat Ridge Ministries is recognized throughout the world as an independent Lutheran charitable organization that seeds new ministries of health and hope in the name of the healing Christ. Over 100 ministries are currently receiving assistance through Wheat Ridge funding. 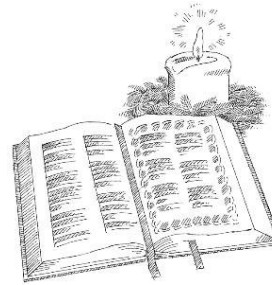


A little history on one familiar Christmas Carol

You may already know this, but I thought it interesting. There is one Christmas Carol that has always baffled me. What in the world do leaping lords, French hens, swimming swans, and especially the partridge who won't come out of the pear tree have to do with Christmas? Today I found out, thanks to the Internet. From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember.

- ❖ The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.
- ❖ Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.
- ❖ Three French hens stood for faith, hope and love.
- ❖ The four calling birds were the 4 gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- ❖ The five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.
- ❖ The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.
- ❖ Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit: Prophecy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.
- ❖ The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.
- ❖ Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control.
- ❖ The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.
- ❖ The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- ❖ The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.

2 Cents-A-Meal



A Spiritual Discipline and Shared Ministry for Reducing Hunger

Most of us rarely spend a day with nothing to eat. Yet hunger is an everyday fact of life for an epidemic number of families. **Did you know** that in Ohio, over one million persons (nearly 17% of the population!) are living in poverty and experiencing "food insecurity"? Nearly 500,000 children live in households that are food insecure with one in six going to bed hungry or at risk of hunger every night. How do we as Christians respond to these, our neighbors in need?

You as members of Hosanna are being asked to embrace this new program called 2 Cents-A-Meal which provides money for your local and Ohio families in need of food assistance. It is simple. By placing a container near or by your table when you sit down for a meal, place two pennies for each person eating and say a prayer that your pennies will bless those that will receive your donations. If you eat three meals a day times seven days, you would only be placing a total of 42 cents a week in your container but; what a difference that can make for someone that has nothing. This is less than the cost of a cup of coffee. Combined with many others, your 42 cents a week can feed many.
