Money Matters and Figures

Approved Operating Budget for 2009: \$ 387,932.00

We must average approximately \$7,460.24 per week in offerings to meet our 'weekly' budgeted amount. Thru July 2009, we have had 30 Sundays, which means we should have received \$223,807.20 in offerings; we have received \$212,546.42; we are in a deficit of \$11,260.78.

Hosanna's financial operating position through July 30, 2009 is as follows:

- Total Operating Income in July: \$ 23,043.36
Total Operating Expenses for July: \$ 29,377.55
July deficit: (\$ 6,334.19)

Year To Date (YTD) Operating Income thru 07/31- \$ 198,649.25

YTD Operating Expenses Paid thru 07/31- \$ 212,546.42

2009 YTD Deficit (\$ 13,897.17)

Second quarter benevolence was paid to ELCA on July 20, 2009 for \$3,430.01.

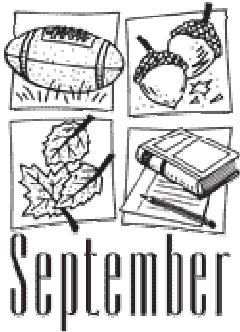
Hosanna Fall Music Festival
