From the Pastor

LENT is upon us; a season awaiting new life, growth and spring. It's a six week opportunity to renew and strengthen our walk with Christ; to perhaps discover places of His presence that we have failed to see in our busy life.

So, we shall be emphasizing Lent as "A Season to Grow in Grace." The "garden tools" of Lent (otherwise known as disciplines) are four:

- Repentance (which means "Returning to God as our Center")
- Prayer (cultivating our conversation with God)
- Fasting (practicing a discipline that sharpens our focus in life)
- Deeds of kindness and mercy

We pastors and worship planners wish to encourage you to think more of Growth than Retreat. Culturally, Lent has become a time of "giving up" for the sake of pulling back. In truth it's a time to prepare for forward movement, cultivating the soil of our soul.

To that end, we wish to encourage your

- Worship & Prayer. Wednesday's in Lent (Ash Wednesday is Feb 17) will contemplate The Lord's Prayer. Each week we will receive a presentation on each petition. We hope this will enrich the prayer that too often has become rote in our speaking.

- Repentance (centering on God). This newsletter contains a daily reading of scripture for your quiet contemplation. Plan to cultivate your mind with the "two edged" hoe of God's word that encourages faith and confronts our sin.
- Fasting. Discipline has always been a struggle for me. I don't easily do the same thing twice in a row! Yet, we all know that without strength we have difficulty standing against the winds of trial and tribulation. What aspect of your character needs strengthening? Don't just "give up;" build up!
- Deeds of kindness and mercy. Please, get a jump start on this by contributing to the relief of suffering in Haiti. During Lent we will grow a Mercy Garden in the entry way. There will be an enclosure next to the Information Center for you to drop off the perishable food items needed by our community service agency, LEADS. May our Garden overflow with food for the weary.

May this be a season of growth in ways we cannot even imagine today. How lovely is the garden of growing people and talents.

Money Matters and Figures

Approved Operating Budget for 2009: \$ 387,932.00

We must average approximately \$7,460.24 per week in offerings to meet our 'weekly' budgeted amount. Thru December 2009, we have had 52 Sundays, which means we should have received \$387,932.48 in offerings and other income; we have received \$369,609.16, which resulted in a deficit of (\$ 18,323.32).

Hosanna's financial operating position through December 31, 2009 is as follows:

Offerings and other income for December 2009 totaled: \$ 51,332.55

Total Operating Expenses for December 2009: \$ 25,741.63

December deficit: \$ 25,590.92

Year To Date (YTD) Offering and Other Income thru 12/31: \$ 369,609.16 *

YTD Expenses thru 12/31: \$ 365,697.54

2009 YTD Overage thru 12/31: \$ 3,911.62

*Figure includes the 2 cashed CD's

Using the carryover overage from 2008: \$ 7,183.75

to our 2009 YTD overage of: \$ 3,911.62

Total overage is: \$ 11,095.37

Fourth quarter benevolence for \$4,274.22 was paid on January 11, 2010.

Our 2010 approved budget is \$398,973.32. We need to average approximately \$7,672.56 per week in offerings and other income to reach this approved budget goal for 2010. For 2010, this is a weekly increase of \$212.32 over the 2009 budget figure.

Break the pattern in 2010--Consider Electronic Giving-- Make electronic giving the preferred way to donate. The most successful churches don't just offer electronic donation options—they let members know it's the church's preferred method for receiving contributions! Even a small number of recurring contributions can reduce the impact of the summer donation slump.

Food (or cash) for thought: Check and cash contributions will increase dramatically at Easter only to drop off sharply the following month. Break this pattern with recurring donation solutions with electronic giving.

O God of abundance, help me to see that all receiving is not without pain. Give me the strength to endure anguish that I may discover the joy you have in store for me. May I always know that Jesus is with me, and that your will is for joy in my life. Amen.

In the past, Thrivent has picked up the small cost of this service, but has decided to eliminate this from their service for the future. As such, Hosanna pays a small fee for each transaction that occurs under the Vanco Automatic Deduction, so we would like to encourage people to continue to use this handy service, but consider making a once monthly deduction rather than a weekly one as in the past.

While the fiscal impact is fairly small, we are trying to save every way we can, and we certainly do not want to discourage use of this service, but would ask that you consider this change if possible.

In 2009, over 13,000 groups participated in Souper Bowl of Caring, generating over \$10 million. All of the money collected at Hosanna will be donated to Lutheran Social Services. None of the money is sent to the Souper Bowl of Caring headquarters. Organizers only ask that each participant report their collection so national totals can be determined and announced. Since the Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990, more than \$60 million has gone to help people in need. Please support the youth of our church in this effect to "love our neighbors" by dropping your dollar (or more) in the soup pot on February 7th.

As we enter the colder winter months we also have to pay close attention to inclement weather and school closings. HLCC will not close unless Licking County is under a Level II Snow Emergency. With that being said, we also encourage parents to use their discretion when deciding whether or not to bring their child to school. Depending on where you live it could be easy or difficult to get your child to and from HLCC. When a Level II occurs we will change the school website's main page to reflect the closing as well as provide the information to WBNS 10TV. The decision will be made and closings will be posted no later than 7 AM on that given day. As always, if you decide not to bring your child to school due to inclement weather, we will send home any missed activities on their next day in attendance.

Another important note is that enrollment for alumni families for the 2010-2011 school year is underway. The form is available in the Director's Office, as well as online under the forms tab.
