From the Pastor

Are you dragging junk throughout Lent?

During this season of Lent we have been preparing ourselves to journey with Jesus to the Cross. At Hosanna, we have suggested more constant prayer, more intentional worship, scripture reading, deeds of kindness, and other methods of repentance. It is never too late to turn ourselves to God.

Yet, these spiritual practices are only useful if we will be changed from the inside out. In other words, if we are going to **BELIEVE OURSELVES** to be cleansed from our sin by the cross of Christ, our spiritual lives need to look and feel different.

Christ has conquered sin and death by his victory on the cross. Does this really make a difference in the way we see ourselves? By the cross, does Jesus truly lift the burden of sin from your soul?

James Dobson, a Christian educator, suggests that poor self-esteem can drag us down by its weight upon our shoulders, as heavy as the weight of sin.



"If I were to draw a caricature that would symbolize the millions of adults with low self-esteem, I would depict a bowed, weary traveler. Over his shoulder, I would place the end of a mile-long chain to which is attached tons of scrap iron, old tires, and garbage of all types. Each piece of junk is inscribed with the details of some humiliation-- a failure-- an embarrassment- a rejection from the past. He could let go of the chain and free himself from the heavy load which immobilizes and exhausts him, but he is somehow convinced that it must be dragged throughout life ... Paralyzed by its weight, he plods onward, digging a furrow in the good earth as he goes. You can free yourself from the weight of the chain if you will but turn it loose."

Will you keep Jesus from lifting the burden from your soul, by clutching such a heavy weight, when he has already paid the price and won the victory for you? Or will you turn it loose?

Money Matters and Figures

Approved Operating Budget for 2010: \$398,973.32

We must average approximately \$7,672.56 per week in offerings to meet our 'weekly' budgeted amount. For 2010, this is a weekly increase of \$212.32 over the 2009 budget figure. In January 2010, we only averaged \$5,665.95 weekly.

Thru January 2010, we have had 5 Sundays, which means we should have received \$38,362.80 in offerings and other income; we have received \$28,327.98 which resulted in a deficit of \$10,034.82.

Hosanna's financial operating position through January 31, 2010 is as follows:

Offerings and other income for January 2010 totaled: \$ 28,327.98
Total Operating Expenses for January 2010: \$ 24,962.26
January overage: \$ 3,365.72

Using the carryover overage from 2009: \$ 11,845.37
to our 2010 YTD overage/deficit of: \$ 3,365.72
Total overage is: \$ 15,211.09

Benevolence:

Total benevolence paid for 2009: \$14,479.68.

Hosanna received \$1,912.61 in donations that were sent to the Southern Ohio ELCA Synod for the Haiti Relief Fund in February 2010.

Hosanna collected \$371.30 from Souper Bowl Sunday to sent a check for that amount to Lutheran Social Services on February 8th.

Cookies for Kairos

Bob Willey, Tom Wolf, Randy Rich and a team of volunteers are preparing to go into The Marion Correctional Institution as part of Kairos Prison Ministry to give a three day course in Christian Community to 42 inmates. On each weekend we take in nearly 10,000 dozen homemade cookies which turn out to be a ministry of their own. We've seen lives changed and the prison environment improved because of these cookies and this ministry. Many inmates find it VERY touching that somebody on the outside baked cookies for them.

But the Body of Christ is bigger than just us volunteers so we need help. We need prayers and we need cookies. Please consider baking as few as two dozen cookies (Please, NO icing or dusting with powdered sugar). Place the cookies in gallon sized zip lock bags marked "KAIROS" and leave them in the church kitchen by Sunday, April 11th. You can bake them NOW and we will freeze them.

If you want to help but do not bake, financial donations are greatly needed.

*****If the AM session is closed, the PM session will always be closed.*****

If we cancel the whole day:

By 7 AM, I will make a decision. We will automatically close if Licking County is under a Level II snow emergency or if Licking County is under a Level I snow emergency and Southwest Licking Schools and Licking Heights is closed.

Once that determination is made I will:

1. Update the main page on the website.
2. Send out an email blast to everyone registered in our email system notifying you of the closing.
3. Call WBNS 10TV and update their school closings list to show HLCC as closed.

If we cancel the PM session:

By 11:30 AM, I will make the determination for the afternoon session. The same guidelines from above will apply. The only other factor would be if both school districts are closing early.

Once that determination is made I will:

1. Update the main page on the website.
2. Send out an email blast to everyone registered in our email system notifying you of the closing.
3. Call each parent in the PM session to notify you of our closing.
4. Call WBNS 10TV and update their school closings list to show HLCC as closed.

All of these things are automatic, but; I do ask that you use your own discretion when determining whether or not to bring your child to school. Our school is so full of people who literally live throughout Pataskala that the main roads may be easily accessible to some families while other families can't get to the main roads due to treacherous side roads or back roads. We don't want anyone to be in danger trying to attend preschool! If your child is absent, please give us a call. If there are special activities going on in the classroom we will set aside supplies for your child to complete another day or to take home and complete with Mom or Dad.
